Publishing system as the new tool for the open access promotion at the university

The University Pardubice (UPa) launched its institutional repository Digital Library of the UPa (DL) in 2007. Nowadays the repository provides the access to more than 20 thousands of theses and research outputs (46 % of records contains full text) and is compatible with the DRIVER and OpenAIRE Guidelines. The import of theses from the University Information System is fully automated, other document types are submitted manually by the university librarians. Currently the most of research outputs submitted to the DL are articles from the university peer-reviewed journals and conference proceedings. After the adaption of the internal University Bibliographic Database the research outputs published outside the UPa will be automatically exported to the DL in accordance to the publisher's rights. The launch of these import is planned for the 2012.





Picture 1: The OJS main page at the University of Pardubice

Peer-reviewed journals published by the Upa (initial state)




Own website, registered in DOAJ.








Manually submitted to the Dspace.

As the way how to promote the golden open access, in the autumn 2011 the University Library asked the journal's boards to change their workflows and improve the journal visibility and appearance via the automated publishing system Open Journal System (OJS). After the positive response it was decided about the new library service which will provide the technical and information support for the OJS. One installation of OJS will host the chosen university peer-reviewed journals. The Library will ensure the basic settings of each journal and train its users. The boards will be also informed about their possibilities on the open access field, which means Creative Commons licenses, finances, metadata harvesting,... To keep the continuity the metadata and full texts of volumes which are submitted to the DL will be imported to the OJS and vice versa in the future the OJS will be harvested by the DL. According to the interests of the journals the older paper versions can be digitized and submitted to the OJS archive as well.
