## **Other Comments on the Thesis**

The aim of this research is to identify sustainability concepts that can suit the territorial changes and facilitate physical planning in order to ensure spatial development in selected countries.

I have some reservations:

- a) the theoretical framework of this thesis is very weak, there is no explanation of the basic theses of sustainability and its economic component,
- b) the author chose research methodology as described in Chapter 2. I would expect that the author will also present other methods and approaches that could be used, will discuss and the used method will be presented as a result of this discussion. This is completely missing. I believe that using a "case study" on a similar topic is very weak
- c) In this case, the author himself is an "expert" and qualitatively evaluated the selected criteria within the case study. I am afraid that objective criteria should have been chosen and assessed professionaly.
- d) nowhere I did find out why the author chose Latvia, Hungary and Finland for comparative analysis. The conclusions describe the findings of individual countries, but there is no quality comparison.
- e) both formal and grammatical errors appear in the thesis.
