## Other Comments on the Thesis

The author of the master thesis chose the topic of the analysis of the consequences of corruption in international trade. His thesis is structured neatly and its parts logically flows. Images and tables of thesis effectively complement the analysis.

It is necessary to mention that the cooperation of the student with his supervisor was at a low level, which affects the final impression of the thesis. The supervisor has a whole series of complaints about the work. Essential ones are mainly:

- The selection of variables entering the regression analysis should be better supported and defended by the literature.
- The performed regression analysis does not achieve very reliable results, nevertheless the student draws quite strong conclusions with regard to the results of the regression analysis.
- The literature recommended in the Assignment of diploma thesis was not fully used.

Most of the shortcomings could be eliminated by regular consultations of the thesis.

On the other hand, It is necessary to state that after many obstacles and difficulties during the thesis processing, the quality of the final thesis is good and it can be recommended for defence.

The thesis is not a plagiarism. The highest match rate is 0%.

## Questions and Suggestions for Defence

1. Defend the selection of variables used in the regression analysis.
2. There are many corruption indices. Why did you use the Corruption Perception Index in your analysis? What are the advantages and disadvantages of this indicator?
