#### **Other Comments on the Thesis**

The master's thesis was written satisfactorily, which resulted in the thesis goal being met. The author's work demonstrated his understanding of the application and analysis techniques employed in the thesis development. Several notions of Sustainable Development Strategies were addressed by the author among the selected EU countries. However, there were flaws in the theoretical concept, which failed to fully explain the key themes in the research area, which is common in academic research. The comparative analysis was to deal with a one-of-akind model that used the Tripple Bottom Line (TBL) framework to analyse the strategic, administrative, and outcomes of the selected EU countries' sustainable development, while recommending how regional policies should instil green, sustainable, and inclusive development. Unfortunately, the findings did not meet expectations, causing the discussions and analysis to suffer.

Overall, the student worked with documents from the necessary institutions to figure out the thesis's purpose while making good use of the consultation hours. I believe the analysis might be written more scientifically.
